4) Triangle Region Air Quality Conformity

<u>INFORMATION</u>: The Triangle Region is required to demonstrate air quality conformity for the Triangle's Metropolitan Transportation Plans and TIPs. As a portion of the BGMPO planning area includes Orange County, the TCC is requested to recommend approval of the MTP/TIP conformity determination resolution. In August, the TAC authorized the Chair to sign the resolution after the public meeting. In September, the Air Quality Conformity Determination Report (AQ CDR) was released on November 28 for public comment. A copy of the AQ CDR is available on the BGMPO website. The Report finds that the 2040 MTP meet the air pollution emission thresholds analyzed in the AQ CDR. The adoption resolution is attached.

RECOMMENDATION/ACTION: 1) Review AQ CDR and discuss; 2) Recommend TAC adopt the Air Quality Conformity Determination Report by resolution.

5) Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)/BGMPO Budget FY 2020 Wannetta Mallette

INFORMATION: The Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) for the Burlington-Graham Metropolitan Planning Area is developed annually and outlines all major transportation planning and related activities within the BGMPO Study Area for the upcoming fiscal year (July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020). While it is the mission of the BGMPO to complete work planned within a program year, task elements may span fiscal years and therefore are carried forward into subsequent work programs until completion. The FY 2020 allocation of Federal PL funds estimated at \$263,540 is received through a PL104 planning grant from the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and \$20,000 in Section 5303 and \$120,000 in Section 5307 Transit Planning Funds from the Federal Transit Administration (FTA). As part of the UPWP, the Federal government requires MPO's to certify their transportation planning process on an annual basis. The certification resolution to certify the MPO transportation planning process is attached.

RECOMMENDATION/ACTION: 1) Receive the FY 2020 UPWP report as information and discuss; 2) Recommend the TAC release Draft UPWP for a 30-day public review period; and, 3) If no substantial public comments or changes, recommend TAC approval of the resolution certifying the MPO transportation planning process and adoption of the FY 2020 UPWP report.
